



Pre Camp Head Lice Screening *for Parents*

The kids are off to summer camp. What an exciting time! Before the bathing suit and bug spray is packed, take a moment to check your child's hair for head lice. No one wants their camp experience ruined because of these little pests.

CHECK AHEAD—AVOID THE SPREAD

WHAT ARE HEAD LICE?


Head lice are small grey or reddish brown bugs (1 mm to 4 mm long) depending on their age. Lice live on the human head only. Lice cannot live off the head for more than 24 to 48 hours; they do not hop, jump or fly. Lice can only crawl. The best way to avoid getting them is to avoid head to head contact, not sharing hair items and being careful not to place your head on the areas where an infested person has laid their head.

WHAT DO I LOOK FOR?

Look for lice and lice eggs in the hot spots. These are around the ears, at the crown of the head and at the nape of the neck. It is best to use bright lights and proper magnification when looking. Sunlight is best. Look for red scabs caused by scratching, lice eggs and lice crawling through the hair. Lice attach their eggs on the hair shaft, close to the scalp, but look along the whole hair shaft to be safe. Do not confuse DEC plugs, hair casts or other hair debris with lice eggs. Remember: if it is white like paper or snow, it is not a lice egg.
